

What to Bring or Purchase on Arrival

Beach Items: A swim suit, beach towel, beach footwear, and goggles or snorkeling gear (fins, mask, snorkel) are essential items for having fun and enjoying our island lifestyle.

Bathroom Towels: Two are required.

Bed/Desk Lamp: Rooms have a central ceiling light and, in most rooms, lighting over the desk area. A bedside lamp is recommended for reading in bed. A night light is recommended for the bathroom or for students who are sensitive to darkness (please use a low voltage bulb).

Bedding: Mattress pad, twin sheets, a pillow case, blankets, comforter, or bedspread—it can get cold at night.

Clock/Watch: An alarm clock and watch are essential.

Formal/Aloha Dinner Attire (required): “Formal and Aloha Dinners” on page 48 for appropriate attire.

Hangers: Plastic or plastic-coated wire hangers are recommended because of humidity.

Laundry Supplies: Detergent, cleaning supplies, laundry basket or laundry bag (please mark and label). Washers

and dryers are supplied at no cost; detergent and cleaning supplies are the responsibility of the student.

Padlock: A drawer that can be secured by a padlock is provided in each student’s room. Students are not encouraged to keep more than \$40 or expensive jewelry in their rooms. If students have a great deal of cash, they should ask the Village Campus Office to hold it for them and obtain allowance in installments twice a week. The DRL collects passports, I-20s, and airline tickets from students upon arrival to be placed in the Accounting Office safe of the Upper School.

• Prohibited Items

Prohibited items include, but are not limited to, the following:

- *Drugs* such as tobacco, alcoholic beverages, stimulants, depressants, or any associated drug paraphernalia.
- *Flammable items* such as matches, candles, incense, mosquito coils, Christmas lights, etc.
- *Fireworks:* the use of fireworks is strictly forbidden.

- *Weapons:* guns, knives, martial arts equipment, etc.
- *School keys:* possession of school keys other than to one’s own room is prohibited.
- *Pornographic materials:* i.e., posters, magazines, videos, computer disks, etc.
- *Music or electronic games* with violent or sexually inappropriate content.

If there is reason to believe that any of the above-mentioned items (or other equipment or materials not belonging to the student) is being kept in student’s rooms, the school’s authorities may search the student’s room or conduct a search of all student rooms. Generally, such searches are conducted in the student’s presence. However, the school reserves the right to search a room whether or not a student is present. All searches will be authorized by the DRL or principal.
