#### The HPA Endowment

Endowment gifts go above and beyond the annual support we contribute to the HPA Fund. By establishing a permanent endowed fund, families uphold our programs not only today but far into the future. Endowment fund levels begin at \$25,000 and rise to \$250,000 or higher, depending on the desired impact for HPA.
